HOUSE DOES MUCH BUSINESS

Hon. Dr. Baxter in Critical Mood in Budget Debate -House in Committee Deals With Several Bills.

Fredericton, April 15—The only speaker on the budget debate today was Hon. Dr. Baxter, who will be leader of the opposition during the absence of Hon. James Murray. He criticized the financial statement of the province and also the failure of the government to have a by-election in Carleton to fill the vacancy there. He moved an amendment calling for stoppage of supply until a writ should be issued for the by-election. Maritime union was mentioned by him as a method of securing better terms from the federal government on many matters.

Thirteen bills Disposed of.

Thirteen bills had been disposed of by the committee of the whole when the house arose tonight. Those of general interest included the bills to incorporate the professional engineers of the province, to legitimize children under certain circumstances, and to amend the Succession Duties Act. The engineers bill was sent back to the law committee for amendment to define more clearly the classes of work affected. The bill to ligitimize children born out of wedlock includes within its provisions all such children whose parents subsequently have married or who are married in future. In the case of those whose parents' marriage occurred before the passage of the act property interests will not be affected. The succession duties bill elicited a little passage of arms between Mr. Baxter, who is acting leader of the house during the balance of the session, owing to Hon. J. A. Murray having been called away, and one of his colleagues, Mr. Peck. The latter, in moving that the maximum size of estates free of succession duties should be restored to \$50,000 instead of \$25,000 according to the bill, said that by the time the lawyers got through with it Thirteen Bills Disposed of. according to the bill, said that by the time the lawyers got through with it their were not be much left of a \$25,000 estate. Mr. Baxter rather acridly sug-gested that Mr. Peck confine his criti-cisms to what the government did with the share of the estates which passed into the provincial confers.
