### CHURCH IN NO MAN'S LAND

1 Crater Strangest Place in Which a Y. M. C. A. Preacher Held Services

aria, Aug. 5.—(Correspondence)—over the war zone even out in No man's Land, the soldiers of the American Expeditionary Force seek religious services, often at the additional risk of their lives, and assemble in places of ship as unusual as were the meetings of the early Christians. Never was there such an army whose members seek worship calmly amidst the shadow of hostile aircraft, matter how dangerous the position, the sincere boys from America who overseas for a great, unselfish purpose, always welcome the Y. M. C. A. chaplain who risks his life to reach men to hold Sunday services. A shell crater in No Man's Land was a strange place in which a Y. M. C. A. preacher held services, though others reported the entire field of danger. Pews and pulpits are the least essential requirements. A camouflaged gun emplacement often is the sanctuary and the butt is the pew. In a village under where gatherings were prohibited, his line of men backed against the trees along a street while the speaker turned himself against the opposite wall.

Men seated on the firing step of trenches have listened eagerly to words of comfort, while in an outpost two sat taking out into No Man's Land with their automatics handy, but as much as religious services as were their matches to church. In a little house built by the soldiers who carried summer use of an old chicken coop Sunday morning men sat about a round table, there heard a "Y" man speak from a pitcher's box of a baseball diamond. Another "Y" man stood beside an old one cross near a village church, above which two aeroplanes were swooping down upon others in an attack, and as the villagers pushed their way into the actuary the American spoke quietly, his fellows in khaki. The band did not play its concluding number that

### War Canning Bulletin

Issued by Canada Food Board

With all the transiency of perishable things the fruit comes and is gone, almost before we realize what we are about. We have strawberries today but tomorrow they are out of season. It is the same with cherries, raspberries and all other fruits which Canadian housekeepers want to can.

Then pay attention to the advice of this little Sandwich Lady and can today! There is no time to be lost. Entire success in canning may be explained in two sentences:

(1) The material to be canned must be subjected to enough heat to kill all the forms of microscopic life found in or on it.

(2) After such forms of life have been killed the food product must be hermetically sealed to protect it from exterior sources of re-infection.

Non-success in household canning is due, therefore, either to insufficient sterilization or cooking, or to imperfect sealing.

To guard against failure, write to any of the provincial committees of the Canada Food Board or direct to Ottawa for a booklet on the canning, drying and storing of fruit and vegetables. The price is five cents.

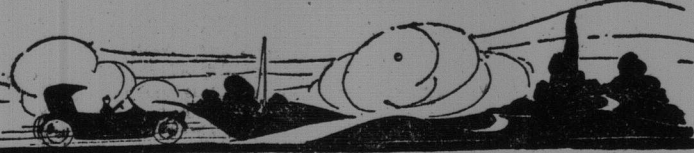
