Pershing Urges Acceptance of Garments From Rer Cross Workers.

With the American Army in France, Mar. 1—(Associated Press.)—A cable-gram forwarded to the Surgeon General at Washington, mentions the value of the garments which volunteer Red Cross workers are making in the United States for the American expeditionary forces. The message contains General Pershing's appreciation of the work done, and recommends that the medical department accept an offer of 100,000 convalescent uniforms which has been made by American women.

General Pershing calls attention to the fact that the medical department is buying large quantities of pajamas, operating gowns, bathrobes, and convalescent suits in the open market, when the Red Cross has offered to supply the articles gratis. This is likely to result in duplication of the supply and an unnecessary demand for tonnage.

General Pershing says that the work done by American women is of service in promoting the morale of the army and is also of value because it releases commercial labor for other purposes.


