Chicago, June 11.—Rejuvenation by transplantation of any kind of glands was branded as mythology before the surgery section of the American Medi-cal Association, by Dr. Clarence A. Mc-Williams, New York surgeon, in an address today. The speaker considered the subject in relation to skin grafts or grafts of internal organs from one creature to another. "In numerous instances I can point out where the uniform result is the dis-appearance of the grafted tissues," Dr. McWilliams asserted. "The scientific reason is that between animals of the same species, even, there are unknown biological differences that prevent the survival of the transplanted arteries. Reported successes would indicate that these grafted organs 'seem to take,' but they suddenly disappear, in a few weeks at the most.




