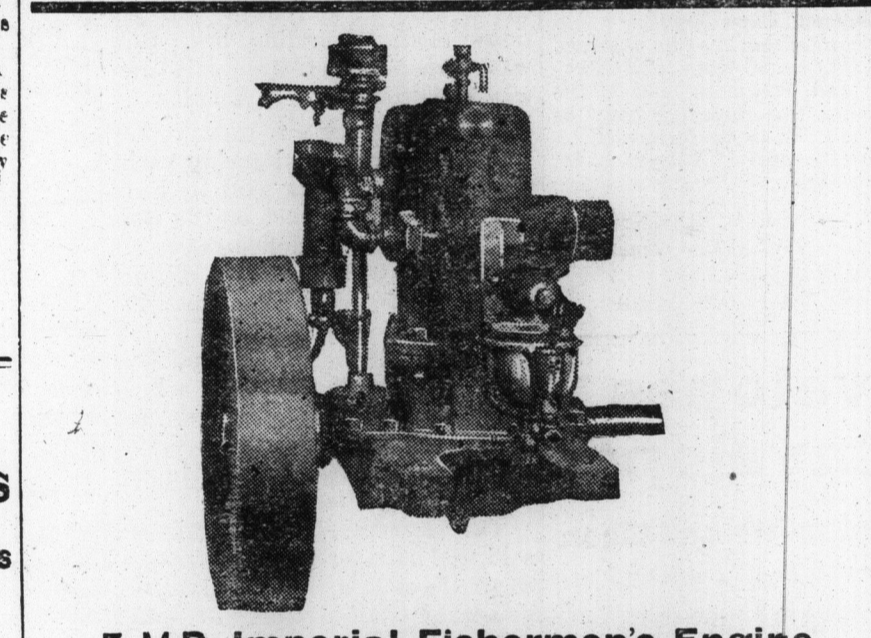

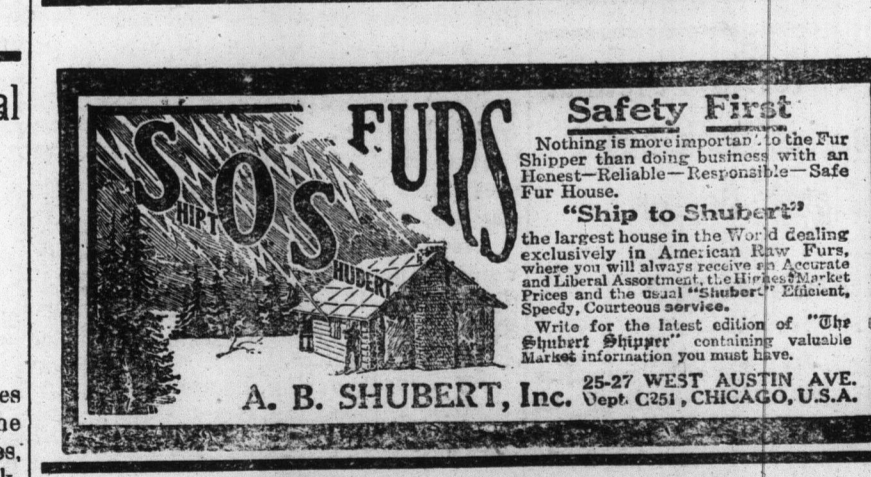

NEWS IN A LINE

The bunch of keys advertised in our "Lost" column last week was found by Mr. John Parsons; ferryman, and restored to the owner. Rev. S. Bennett, who was attending the sessions of the Methodist Conference at St. John's, returned home on Tuesday. Nellie, the 18-year-old daughter of Capt. and Mrs. John Dawe, Coley's Point, passed away this (Friday) morning. Mrs. J. B. Muford, of Port de Grave, went to the Mental Hospital at St. John's on Tuesday to receive medical treatment. The civil servants seem to be taking their cue from those higher up (there are some exceptions) and public matters are often treated very indifferently. We shall return to this subject again. The young man Quinton, to whom we referred in the beginning of this article, was an outport lad, and as an outport newspaper we also demand an enquiry. And we call upon the outport people to wake up. Learn some-

Patriotic Meeting

Lieut. Thistle, of the Nfld. Forestry Battalion, addressed a recruiting meeting, composed chiefly of women and children, in the public building here on Tuesday night last. The chair was occupied by Dr. T. C. McLeod. Lieut. Thistle explained the need there was of men for the Forestry Battalion, and outlined the conditions under which men were being recruited, referring particularly to the rate of pay, which starts at \$1.10 a day; the pension scheme in connection with the Battalion and other matters.

Sergt. Squires, of the Canadian Regt., who is visiting his home at Topsail, was also present and delivered a very interesting account of his experiences as a member of the Canadian Northwest Mounted Police, as a Cavalry scout in the South African War, and latterly as a Sergt. in the firing line around Ypres in France, where he was buried for nearly an hour by the explosion of a German shell.
