The revenue from the sales tax for April was \$2,373,219, of which \$2,186,649 was obtained from the tax on domestic trade and the balance on imports. The revenue from this tax reached its peak in October last when it totailed \$6,020,474; and with the exception of March it has been failing steadily since. The average figure for the ten months contained in the last fiscal year, which ended with March, was \$3,802,616, so that the April returns are nearly a million below the average. The returns for March were \$3,404,571, and this, though it was an exception from a general decline, was considerably below the average for the ten months, under the new rates as \$54,867; and adding the revenue for April under the old rates, the total agency and decline, was considerably below the average for the ten months during which the Sales Tax was in operation last year.
