

His regular pastoral work was with the Churches at Bath, Bumfrau, and Perth, in each of which were gracious revivals of religion. Strength came to many that had been weak; faith increased and grace grew in the hearts of those who had worked and prayed. Sinners cried out unto God for mercy, and were made happy as, passing through the straits of regeneration, they entered into the light and liberty of the Gospel.

At Bath the Pastor baptized eight, and added them to the Church. At Bumfeau, sixteen were added by baptism, and fourteen by letter. Six were added by baptism to the Church at Perth. Brother Barnes also visited the Church at Wright Settlement. Here his labors were blessed, and souls were converted. Seven were baptized and received into membership with the Church.

Rev. C. F. Rideout has resided within the limits of this District during a part of the year. The Churches and Settlements which have been visited by Bro. Rideout have been encouraged and helped.

Licentiate F. A. Currier has cared for and spent all of his time during the year with the Churches at Arthurette and Long Island. Three have been added by baptism to the Church at Long Island.

Six of the Churches have had pastoral care during the year. The same number have regular weekly prayer meetings. Seven hold monthly Conference meetings. The average attendance at the prayer meetings, including the six Churches, is 178.

Concerning the non-reported Churches of this District we have received no information. We presume, however, that they are very low and weak, and that they afford a good field for earnest missionary work.

There have been added to the Churches of this District, by baptism 39; by letter 14; total 53; less by decrease 4; net increase 49.
