MORE THAN 100 DEAD IN ITALIAN EARTHQUAKE

Catania, Sicily, May 8.—A great earthquake last night brought down a destruction to many villages near Mount Etna.

The affected zone extends from Zuffena, the highest village on Mount Etna, to the sea between Ad Reale, on the south, and Giarre on the north.

The earthquake was felt in Sicily, Calabria, Campania and the island of Sicily. In Calabria, 300 persons were killed and 300 injured.

PORT'S EXPORTS ARE \$5,079,030 BEHIND

The winter port season has practically ended as the export manifests of the liners which have departed in the winter service have been filed at the customs house and only one cargo remains to be forwarded, that for the New Zealand liner Southern, which is scheduled at Sydney.

The value of the exports handled this year is less than the value of the total for the previous season by \$5,079,030; this year the manifest values totalled \$24,577,505, and in 1913 the total was \$29,656,535.

Services this year consisted of 117 arrivals and 99 departures with transatlantic cargo, 15 West Indies arrivals and departures, and 18 departures for United States ports.

In 1913 transatlantic arrivals and departures were 133 and 126 respectively.
