

Lauder, late of Bewcastle, Cumberland, Eng. A collateral ancestor was one of the claimants for the Roxburgh Estates in 1812. B. at Bewcastle, 1834. Ed. at Canobie and Langholm M., 1856, Miss M. E. Toof. Called to the Bar, U.C., Easter Term, 1864. A mem. of the Senate of Univ. of Victoria College, Cobourg. Apptd. Govt. trustee of Municipal Bonus Fund of Toronto, Grey & Bruce Railway, 1869. First returned to Parlt. at g.e., 1867. Again returned at g.e., 1871, but unseated on petition. Re-elected, Jan., 1872. A Liberal.—261, *Jarvis St., Toronto.*

McCALL, SIMPSON. [*South Norfolk.*]

Descended from Donald McCall, a native of Argyleshire, Scot., who came to Can. with the 42nd Regt., and was at the taking of Quebec in 1759. B. at Vittoria, Ont., 5 Dec., 1807. Ed. at London Dist. Grammar School. M., 1835, Miss Priscilla Lamport of Woodstock, Ont. Was Postmaster of Vittoria for thirty-two years; a District and County Councillor for sixteen years; and Warden of Norfolk for five years. First returned to Parlt. at g.e., 1867. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Vittoria, Ont.*
