TO HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN :

1. **Message** received from the Senate desiring the concurrence of the House in an Address to Her Majesty the Queen, congratulating Her Majesty on Her recent Providential escape from assassination; House concurs *nem. con.*; **Message** to the Senate acquainting them that the House has agreed to the Address; **Address** to His Excellency to transmit the same, 105. **Cable Despatch** from Secretary of State for the Colonies, acknowledging receipt of the Address, 117. **Copy of Despatch** from Secretary of State for Colonies acknowledging receipt of the Address, 321.
2. On motion for House to go into Committee of Supply, Mr. Costigan moved in amendment that an humble Address be presented to Her Majesty, regretting the distress and discontent which have prevailed for some time amongst Her Majesty's subjects in Ireland, and suggesting to Her Majesty that Canada and its inhabitants have prospered exceedingly under a Federal system, allowing to each Province of the Dominion considerable powers of self-government, and venturing to express a hope that if consistent with the integrity and well being of the Empire, and if the rights and status of the minority are fully protected and secured, sure means may be found of meeting the expressed desire of so many of Her Irish subjects in that regard, so that Ireland may become a source of strength to Her Majesty's Empire, and that Her Majesty's Irish subjects at home and abroad may feel the same pride in the greatness of Her Majesty's Empire, the same veneration for the justice of Her Majesty's rule, and the same devotion to, and affection for, our common flag, as are now felt by all classes of Her Majesty's loyal subjects in this Dominion, and expressing a hope that the time has come when Her Majesty's clemency may without injury to the interests of the United Kingdom be extended to those persons, who are now imprisoned in Ireland charged with political offences only, and the inestimable blessing of personal liberty restored to them, 307. Carried; Main question as amended agreed to, 308. Address to be engrossed; **Message** to the Senate desiring their concurrence, 334. Senate agrees, 402. **Message** from Senate desiring concurrence of the House in an Address to His Excellency, praying him to transmit the Address to Her Majesty; House concurs, 402.
3. **Message** from the Senate desiring the concurrence of the House in an Address to Her Majesty as to the establishment of one Maritime Court for Canada, to take the place of the Maritime Court of Ontario and of the British Vice-Admiralty Courts now existing in Canada, 330. House concurs; **Message** to the Senate to that effect; **Address** to His Excellency praying him to transmit the Address to Her Majesty, 490.
