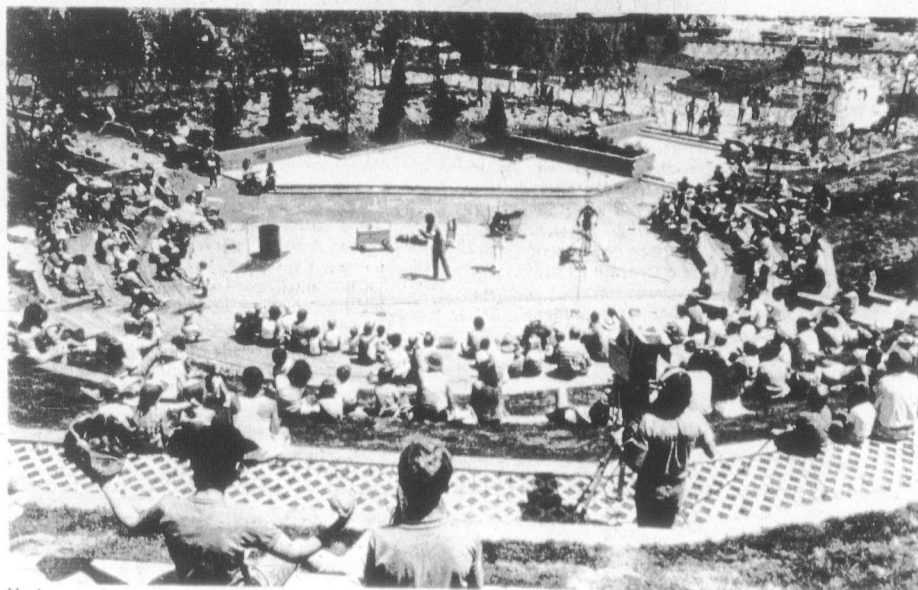

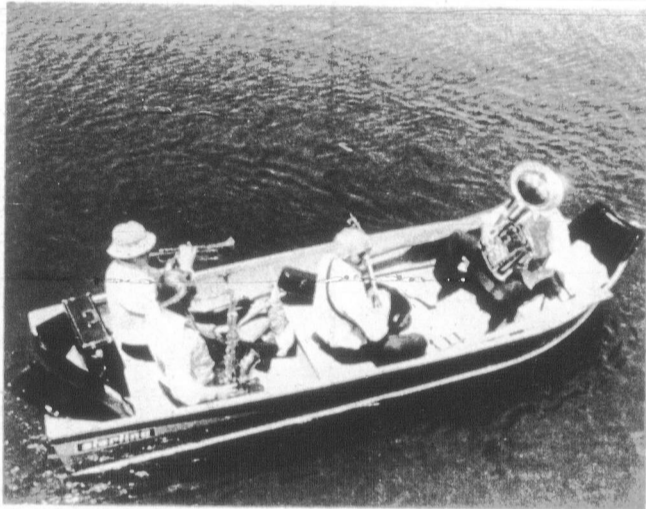


Various events were held at the amphitheatre, which is near the lake.

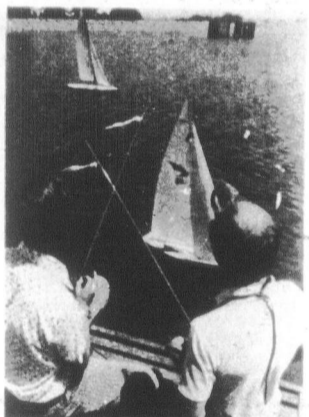
