Sports Field.</p> <p>A picture was shown in the Station Theatre at 1945 hours.</p> <p>All personnel on the Station participated in sports from 1745 to 1845 hours.</p> <p>At 1145 hours Harvard II 3217 groundlooped on Main Aerodrome. The pilot, R184835 LAC White, D.G., was not injured. Categorized C.2.</p> <p>187 Air Cadets arrived by train for 10 days Station Experience. These cadets were from No. 270 Squadron, Noranda, Quebec in charge of AC P/O Hastings True, No. 117 Riverdale Kiwanis Squadron, Toronto, Ontario, in charge of AC P/O G. Arnold. and AC P/O G. Gibson, No. 102 Barrie Squadron, in charge of AC F/O Fisher and AC P/O Clarke, No. 172 Leaside Squadron, Toronto in charge of AC P/O King. These Cadets were accompanied by a band of 30 members under the direction of AC P/O Chenhall. During their stay the Cadets were given a working knowledge of Air Force Procedure and Discipline. The N.C.O.'s were drill tested. Each Cadet was given a medical examination (M.2) by the Medical Officers.
