I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 9th inst. in the matter of the Department's letter to Messrs. Crease and Crease in this connection, and asking to be advised as to what is required in order that you may succeed in getting this Crown Grant registered in the Land Registry Office, at Kamloops.

In reply I have to state that this Department is not in a position to advise you in regard to the desired registration as pointed out in our letter to Messrs. Crease and Crease.

You will note that it is also intimated in said letter that this Department is not in accord with the proceeding proposed. The arrangement, which was made some time ago, in connection with these lands was that in case of application being accepted by the Dominion Government they should surrender and Quit Claim this Indian rights, and that application could then be made to this Department for a Quit Claim of the Provincial reversionary rights in the said lands.

On receipt of such an application, accompanied by the Dominion Quit Claim, this Department is prepared to take into consideration the disposal of our reversionary interest in the land in question.
