The Company shall not be responsible for messages until the same are presented and accepted at one of its transmitting offices; if a message sent to such office by one of the Company's messagengers, he acts for that purpose as the sender's agent; if by telephons, the person receiving the message acts therein as agent of the sender, being authorized agents; the these conditions for the sender.
