

(d) The problem of backwater from the Grand Coulee Dam.

This has been under consideration for some time, and at the present moment a draft has been prepared with a view to inducing a reference by the United States Government to the International Joint Commission.

(e) Storage in the Arrow Lakes

While it is probable that, in the future, there will be a movement to make provision for storage in the Arrow Lakes, at the present time no active steps have been taken to this effect by either the Canadian or United States authorities. Storage in the Arrow Lakes would be of practically no value to Canadian power interests, but would be of great value to the producers of power at Grand Coulee. It is likely, however, that it will be a long time before they will need to have their power augmented at Grand Coulee, and it may be a good many years before there is any movement on the part of the United States authorities to make provision for storage in Canada.
