Ottawa, 23rd May 1916.

Sir,

Referring to your letter of the 6th instant I beg to inform you that the right of way of the Grand Trunk Railway across lots 14 and 15 in the Rama Indian Reserve is 66 feet, 33 ft. on the North side of the centre line and 33ft. on the South side of the centre line.

Across lots 16 and 17 the lands purchased by the railway company are 50 ft. wide on the North side of the centre line and 150 ft. wide on the South side of the centre line. In addition to this the company subsequently purchased all the land and marsh containing seventeen acres in lots 16 and 17, lying to the West of the land they previously purchased and Lake St. John and the road allowance of the Gore of concession 3.

Please inform me as soon as possible if the company has taken in any lands outside of the above described limit. The railway company has made no recent purchase of land in this locality.
