

to Canada with his family & settled in business as
an merchant in Montreal, but not ^{and} succeeding to
his expectations, he went back to the States and
lived there afterwards, where his son was educated
entered the American Army & served as
Surgeon in one of their Regiments; he resigned
some years ago, came immediately to this Province
& married his Cousin the daughter of Mr
McGinnis of Lacadie, where he has since
resided. When Mr Walsmsley arrived in
the country he applied to the Governor for admission
to the medical Board of Montreal, accompanying
his petition a certificate with a certificate
signed by several of the most respectable of the
old inhabitants of this place of their knowledge
of his Father having been a respectable merchant
in Montreal, about the period above mentioned.
Judge Ready in his answer informed the petitioner
that he must complete the seven year residence
in this Province before he could be admitted
to take the oath of allegiance, and it appears
from Judge Py's certificate that he has been
naturalized according to law.

the American Army, & upon enquiry as well
as from the personal knowledge of some of the
members of the Board, there is nothing against
