

## SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

In the case of L-22915 Sapper (Lance-Corporal) Morrison, W.B. of No.1 Cdn Road Constr. Coy., R.C.E.

The Commanding Officer directs that the evidence be taken on oath.

## FIRST WITNESS

Lieutenant Hamilton Alexander MANTLE of 1 Canadian Road Construction Company, Royal Canadian Engineers, an officer of the Canadian Army Overseas, being duly sworn, states:-

"I am Lt. H.A. Mantle, Section Officer of 1 Cdn Road "I am Lt. H.A. Mantle, Section Officer Constr. Coy., Royal Canadian Engineers, Canadian Army Overseas. At approximately 2000 hrs., 11 Aug. 44, I Overseas. At approximately 2000 hrs., 11 Aug. 44, I arrived at the area where two power shovels of this Coy. were loading dump trucks of which L/Cpl. Morrison, W.B. was in charge. One shovel was closed down for maintenance and I questioned Cpl. Frice J. of this Coy. as to the whereabouts of L/Cpl. Morrison. I was told that he had been there until a few moments before. I then went to the other shovel which was the only one loading the trucks. L/Cpl. Morrison was not there and did not put in an appearance for approximately one hour, during which time about ten loads were put out. At approximately 2100 hrs. I made inquiries of French civilians (names unknown) if they had seen L/Cpl. Morrison. A woman called L/Cpl. Morrison and I returned to the working shovel. At approximately 2100 hrs. L/Cpl. Morrison appeared. He had been drinking and was not in condition to carry out his required duties."

The accused declines to question the witness.

## SECOND WITHESS

Major Campbell FRASER of Ho.1 Canadian Road Construction Company, Royal Canadian Engineers, an officer of the Canadian Army Overseas, being duly sworn, status:-

"I am Major Campbell Fraser, Officer Commanding, N Canadian Road Construction Company, Royal Canadian Canadian Road Construction Company, Royal Canadian Engineers, Canadian Army Overseas. At approximately 2215 hrs., 11 Aug. 44, Lt. H.A. Mantle reported to me that L/Cpl. Morrison had been absent from his duty and that when he returned, he was in no fit condition to continue with his duties. L/Cpl. Morrison was at this time atanding beside the Orderly Room truck, approximately 8 ft. from me. I watched him for several minutes and of ft. from me. I watched him for several minutes and noticed that his movements were not completely under control, he was swaying on his feet and had difficulty in lighting a cigarette. I did not speak to him. In my opinion, he was at that time unfit to continue with the duties which had been assigned to him. I ordered him to be held in arrest, pending further investigation.

The accused declines to question the witness.
