2. hardship to refuse. Young Indians who are capable of obtaining work are certainly not entitled to them, - it is more for the older class of Indians who have been in the habit of hunting all their lives and feel more severely the enforcement of the present game laws. I also would ask you to particularly call the attention of the Indians to the fact that an abuse of the privileges connected with such permits would simply result in all permits being cancelled.
