They bore seal of circumcision which marked them as sharers in covenant which God made with Abraham and his seed t To them alone the prophets had been sent; w them alone God was in communication; to them alo He gave His law, and the ordinances of grace, and forms worship; and of them Christ had come. All was of Isra and for Israel.

The Gentiles are reminded that they were aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the commants of the promise, having no hope and without God in tworld. And what was true in Paul's time, is true to-date The heathen world is here described. But this sad concion is not confined to those we call heathen. The same is true of those in Christian lands, who though they he the Gospel and are familiar with its terms, are yet with
