BY-LAW NO. 9.

A By-law to Repeal By-law No. 9 of the Standing By-laws of the Township of Brooke, in so far as the payment of a Bonus to parties Planting Trees is concerned.

PASSED 30TH APRIL, 1896.

BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Township of Brooke. 1. That Section 5 and 6 of Standing By-law No. 9 of the Township of Brooke, passed on the 17th November, 1883, he and they are hereby repealed. in so far as the Township is liable to pay or offer any bonus for the planting of trees along side of the highway or on or near any boundary line.

2. Nothing in this By-law tends to lessen the penalties incurred by any person or persons who injures or des-troys any tree or trees growing upon or near any road or highway or upon public street, lane, ally, place or square in this Municipality.
