PUBLIC SCHOOLS

For school purposes the city is divided into six districts, in each of which there is a district school. Over each district is placed a head master, who has supervision, not only of his own school, but also of the primary schools of the district

District I, or Queen's school district, includes that part of the city south of King and east of James; head master, W C Morton. The schools in this district are: The Queen school, the

Hunter street school, the Boys' Home, the Orphans' Home

District II, or Central school district, bounded by King st on the north, James st on the east, city limits on the south, and on the west by a line passing along Caroline to Hunter, along Hunter to Queen, and along Queen to King st; head master, S B Sinclair, B A. The schools in this district are: The Central school and the Main street school

District III, or Ryerson school district, including that part of Ward 3 being west of a line passing along Caroline, Hunter and James sts; head master, Walter H Davis. The schools in this district are: The Ryerson, Hannah st, Mountain ave and Girls' Home

District IV, or Hess st school district, includes Ward 4; head master, A S Cruickshank. The schools in this district are: Hess st, Murray st, Market st and Pearl st schools

District V, or Cannon st school district, includes Ward 5 and Ward 6 west of Ferguson ave; head master, T L Kinrade. The schools in this district are: Cannon st, Picton st, Mary st and Hughson st schools

District VI, or Victoria school district, includes Ward 7 and Ward 6 east of Ferguson ave; head master, John Ross. The schools in this district are: Victoria ave, West ave, Wentworth st, Wellington st and Sherman ave schools

There are 23 schools, 160 teachers, and a regular attendance of over 7000 pupils
