GUELPH CHAMPION BREAKS CANADIAN RECORD.

It was the subject of a great deal of comment when the fact became known that the 3-yr-old heifer, Colantha Heifer Girl, owned by M. H. Haley, Springfield, Ont., had won a sweepstakes in a dairy test over all ages and breeds, making the highest score ever made in a dairy test at Guelph. Surely this is a remarkable feat for any heifer, but since being brought to her own stable, and May being unable to conceive, she is a fine tester for over a week. She has made a new 34½ Canadian record for 3-yr-olds. It was recorded by all Holstein breeders that this same heifer holds the Canadian 30 day record for 30 days. The fact is 3-yr-old record for Canadian 30 day records, together with a monthly, made within 12 months, make it a record of the month for any heifer, she having made for 30 days, 2,483 lbs. milk, containing 12.52 lbs. butter and for 7 days 558 lbs. milk, making 33 lbs. butter. It will be noticed that it seems to be a characteristic of her family to be Canadian champions, her first champion being her daughter, also her full sister B. B. Payne, holds the 3-yr-old test of these heifers as a record of possibly the greatest transmitting sire of the breed, Colantha Johanna Ltd.
