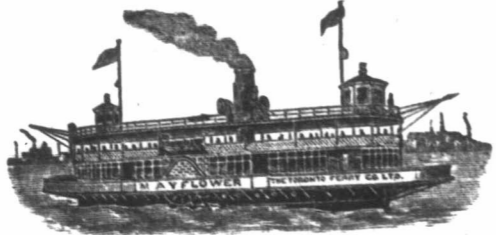

These photographs are the only ones which were taken during the sitting of the Synod. That of the Bishops is particularly fine, and with its background of Trinity University walls and the cloister connecting it with the Chapel, makes a handsome picture. The price of each, if sold alone, is \$2.
