UNFORTUNATE ERROR OF DUNLOP'S CAUSE BRANTS TO LOSE GAME

FORAN AGAIN SMASHES OUT A HOMER—BREAK WAS NOT WITH THE BRANTS—RUBE DENEAU UMPIRED FOR FIRST TIME HERE—FINAL SCORE WAS 6-3.

It was undoubtedly Dunlop's error that put the hash on the game yesterday for the Brants. There is no excuse for him; it was nothing but a bonehead play. It was Shaughnessy's grounder that he picked up and should have thrown to Ivers, but he pegged it wildly to Mullen, who would have had a hard time to get it even if he had been expecting it.

There were also some good plays, and one of them was pulled off by Burrill, who caught Bullock out at centre and made a beautiful peg home, holding Carlton on third. Ottawa pulled off a double play when Fuller caught a hot drive from Ivers' bat, and, throwing to Powers, put Dunn out.

Foran made another of his home runs, again smashing it out over the centre field fence. Burrill lined out a hot one to Shag shortly after, and if he had not deflected its course by touching it, it would have gone over for a homer. As it was, it hit the fence and bounded back, allowing Burrill to make only a double.

Friedl jammed out a beautiful grounder to the scoreboard, upon which he could have made home, or at least third, if it had not been a foul.

Two base hits were rapped out by Mullen and Peterson and two doubles by Burrill.

Higgins certainly has something on the ball, for he had the Senators guessing for fair. He struck out ten of them. The Ottawa twirler only struck out seven, but he made a beautiful play in the second. With two men out and two on bases he purposely gave Matty a walk, and when Higgins came to bat, struck him out. A play like this can be dreamt of, but rarely seen.

The Senators also had a bone chalked up to them in the fifth inning. Dunn was given his base on balls, and he held his base when Ivers slammed out a high fly to Shag. When Burrill made his double it drove Dunn around to third. Shag had returned Burrill's ball to Rooney, who pegged a wild one to Snykal. This error allowed Dunn to score and Burrill to make third base. The next two men were put out and Burrill was held on third.

It certainly looked good to see Deneau back on the field, even if he was not playing. His decisions were quick and decisive. They were good ones, too, and "Rube" proved himself to be a first-class umpire by favoring neither
