SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS. FREE sale land of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a plot not appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for quarter-section of available Dominion land in certain districts. Prices \$3.00 per acre. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (Det. Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Free exemption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent is issued. Duties—Six months residence upon each cultivation of the land in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. A minimum of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$2.00 per acre.

A settler who has exhausted his home-land right may take a purchased home-land in certain districts. Prices \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to a survey in case of crop, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. COLE, C.M.G., Deputy of the Minister of the Interior, B. B. Osbourne, Registrar of Lands and Settlements, Ottawa, Ont.
