DEATHS GALORE

From Heat in New York, Brooklyn, Philadelphia and Other Cities

TOTAL OF 387 DIE ON SECOND OF JULY

On the Same Date There Were Over 1000 Prostrations

LIGHTNING RUINS CHURCH

Steamer Elk City Lands Cargo of Passengers 20 Miles From Nome. They Lay Out Townsite.

New York, July 3, via Skagway, July 8.—There were 225 deaths and 375 prostrations from heat in this city yesterday. In the four cities of New York, Brooklyn, Philadelphia and Pittsburgh there was a total of 387 deaths from heat and over 1000 prostrations yesterday. In the suburb of New York lightning killed 11 people and injured many others. It demolished a church in Brooklyn, the damage being \$250,000. Three people were instantly killed and many injured by lightning in St. Louis.

Seattle, July 2, via Skagway, July 8.—The steamer Centennial just returned from Nome, says the steamer Elk City in spite of the ice landed freight and passengers 20 miles from Nome on June 19th and that the passengers immediately laid the sand spit out in a townsite which they named Elk City.

LOYAL TO CANADA

Ministers and Ex-Governor Generals Say "No No" at Dominion Day Dinner

WHEN CHAMBERLAIN MADE STATEMENT

That Thirty Years ago They Were Ready to Absorb With U.S.

COLONIAL SECRETARY INSISTS

That Such Was Then the Sentiment but England Now Wants Canada's Council, Advice and Arms.

London, July 1, via Skagway, July 8.—Lord Strathcona and the Mount Royal presided at the Dominion Day dinner at the Hotel Cecil, which was attended by 300 persons, including Lords Chamberlain, Aberdeen and other former Canadian governor-generals; also Sir Louis Davis, David Mills, Sidney Fisher and the other Canadian ministers now in London, as well as Gen. Ian Hamilton and Rear Admiral Douglas Milhorn Parker. In speaking of Canada's material progress Chamberlain said:

"Thirty years ago your thoughts might have turned to the question of absorption with your powerful but friendly neighbor toward the south." (Received with cries

WRECKED AT FIVE FINGERS

Three Men Narrowly Escape Sinking With Scow.

Five Fingers, July 7.—Yesterday evening at 7 o'clock a scow containing ten tons of new potatoes struck a rock in the left-hand channel of the fingers. The crew consisting of Maing and Peterson, owners, and one other man jumped on the rock and were later safely rescued by the cable men. The scow dipped and filled but passed here and on through Rink Rapids. There is no doubt but that the cargo is a total loss.

West Dawson Counter Petition.

To the Commissioner and Members of the Council of the Yukon Territory: We, the residents of West Dawson, on the left bank of the Yukon, opposite Dawson City, would set before you the following facts, re the so-called West Dawson petition of last Saturday.

- 1. Previous to the recent influx of doubtful characters there were not to exceed 30 residents of this place.
2. With the exception of one or two none of the signers of the petition referred to are bona fide residents of West Dawson, as shown on the map.
3. No lady resident of West Dawson is on the petition.
4. Mrs. Brown whose name appears on the petition resides on a farm nearly two miles down the river towards Forty mile and would have no occasion to visit the townsite but for the ferry boat maintained by George DeLion.
5. Mrs. O'Connor whose name also appears on the petition has no property in West Dawson, but erected a tent outside the limits some few days ago. Should the ferryboat be discontinued she would have no further occasion to visit West Dawson townsite and thus be subjected to alleged annoyance.
6. Mr. and Mrs. Slaughter maintain a roadhouse several miles back of town and do not live in West Dawson proper.
7. The bulk of the names on said petition are unknown to us, the balance non-residents.
8. The bona fide citizens of West Dawson, would represent to you that the DeLion ferryboat is a great accommodation to them and yet could not be maintained by them alone. None others are at all inconvenienced by the recent arrivals. None others have occasion to visit the townsite but to use the ferryboat.
We therefore pray that no official action will be taken which would lead to a suspension of the ferryboat.

ITALIAN CONSUL

Flees for His Life From New York Owing to Many Anarchists' Threats

WITH WHOM HE IS VERY UNPOPULAR

For Revealing Plot to Assassinate King Humbert.

HAS LONG KEPT BODY GUARD

Canadian Minister of Customs Instructs Officer Busby Not to Fly Flag at Skagway.

New York, July 2, via Skagway, July 8.—The Italian consul general has left here and fled to Italy as the result of many threats made against his life by anarchists. For several weeks he has employed a body guard and kept his place of residence a secret. It was he who exposed the plot to assassinate King Humbert and as a result he is much hated by anarchists.

Ottawa, July 2, via Skagway, July 8.

The secretary of state acting for the minister of customs has issued orders to Customs Transit Officer Busby at Skagway directing him to not insist on the display of the British flag contrary to popular feeling as he had originally had no orders from Ottawa to hoist the flag.
