The reduction is due to a decision of the Interstate Commerce Commission, declaring the recent increase of freight rates on grain and grain products on railways east of Chicago to be unjust and unlawful. Both the Canadian Pacific Railway and the Grand Trunk Railway are re-ducing the schedule of charges on grain and flour from points in Ontario to the seaboard. The reduction all round will be two cents per hundred pounds. These will become operative early in May, and will extend to the end of September.
