QUALITY THE FACTOR IN BUTTER TRADE

(Continued from Page One) The consumer is concerned. The great bulk of home made butter finds its way to the consumer through the media of (1) the local store, (2) the jobber and (3) the retailer distributor.

A Quality Basis.

"One suggestion is that butter, like other commodities, be bought and sold on the basis of quality and not by weight. Any farmer or trader knows very well that an inferior quality of any commodity produced on the farm in the factory will not fetch the same price in an open normal market as will a superior article.

Standard of Quality.

"In view of differences in the matter of taste it is difficult to define the word 'quality' as applied to butter so as to suit the ideas of all, but the following is generally accepted by the trade as a reliable standard, viz: 'The flavor should be sweet, free from rancidity or bitter or other objectionable taints.'

Co-operation Will Do It.

"Even if the greatest dairymen are 50,000,000 bushels less than these maximum figures, it will still leave a gross supply of 900,000,000 bushels, and that is a very large amount of wheat for the American crop and is bargained at present with heavy offerings of new Russian wheat.
