The Veedee Demonstrators

Will Visit Hr. Grace and Bell Island Next Week
Their Offices at Mercantile Chambers, 193 Water Street remain open for a few days longer.

During the last three days a large number of letters and telegrams have been received by the Veedee Demonstrators from the outports and other parts of Newfoundland, from Sufferers who have not been able to come to St. John's in order to obtain Trial Treatment and Relief from the Veedee. Enquiries have come in at every moment as to whether the Demonstrators would visit the Outports in order to give their successful Public Demonstrations. This would necessitate their remaining in Newfoundland for another month or more. To their great regret it is quite impossible on account of previous engagements abroad which can only allow them to prolong their stay for a very few days.

They have, therefore, come to the conclusion that the only two Districts which the short time left at their disposal will permit them to visit must be within a short distance from St. John's, and, as such have decided upon Harbor Grace and Bell Island. Arrangements have, therefore, been hurriedly made for their giving next week




