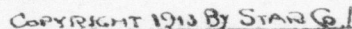

Brantford, Aug. 6. — Ambrose Kane has been released as manager of the Brantford baseball club. President

Nelson was so disgusted this morning when he read the press dispatches from Ottawa concerning yesterday's

game that he immediately wired Kane that his services were no longer required.

In the meantime the team goes to St. Thomas and Wagner has been

placed in charge. Mr. Williams, well known on Montreal, who is to get the ball in Dunkirk, N. Y., and whom several teams have been after, and the other is a pitcher named Davies, who played in Vancouver, B. C., last season, and who has made a reputation for himself."

Asked what he thought of Kane's actions in the Ottawa game on Tuesday, Mr. Nelson replied:

"I am not troubled enough with that."

Wagner will have a chance at managing the team and his work will be closely watched. If he shows up well he may be appointed permanently, according to a source.
