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NEW YORK SAYS GERMANY HAS STOPPED IN CANADA

Enemy's Drive On Warsaw Stopped By the Russians

WOMEN FIGHT FOR THE ENEMY

Russians Claim These Were Taken At Junction of the Bzura River.

ENEMY GETTING BEATEN

Correspondent Says Czar's Troops Have Fought Them To Standstill.

Petrograd, Feb. 9.—The engagements are growing in intensity at the two extremities of the eastern battlefield, in East Prussia as well as in the Carpathians, according to information reaching Petrograd today. The same news sets forth that on the Warsaw front the battle has subsided. The fighting line from the Province of Plock in Russian Poland, as far north as Tilsit, in East Prussia, is virtually continuous.

Women in Trenches.
The Germans today apparently are taking the offensive from Gumbinnen and the Mazurian Lakes as far south as Aluppo, in Poland, on the right bank of the Vistula.

A dispatch reaching here from Warsaw says that among the prisoners taken by the Russians in the fighting at the junction of the Bzura River were a number of German women. According to this message, some of these women were found with rifles in their hands in the first line of trenches.

STILL AFTER WARSAW.

London, Feb. 9.—The Daily Mail's Petrograd correspondent telegraphs: "The Russians have fought the Germans to a standstill, but their force, which crossed the Bzura, has a difficult task before it. The German second-line defences in this quarter are of immense strength. The Kaiser's arrival in Poland suggests that the Germans intend to make a final attempt to capture Warsaw in his honor."

Shows No Failure.

The correspondent of the Times at Petrograd says: "It is thought in authoritative circles that the fresh lull on the Bzura may be due to the withdrawal of a part of the German troops from the Bzura and the Hawka in order to reinforce the armies in East Prussia and the Carpathians. The retirement of the Russian sections in Bukovina is not regarded here as an indication of failure, but rather as a manoeuvre dictated by a desire to occupy a more advantageous position—for instance, to fall back to the plains in order to facilitate the deployment of the Russian forces."

Seek Better Ground.

"During the operations in the mountain regions it often happens that positions adapted for artillery are unsuitable for the assumption of an active movement. Seeing that the Russian retirement coincides with successful operations in other regions, it is permissible to suppose it is connected with a general manoeuvre which is not yet completed."

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GALLERY OPEN FOR BOXES FIREPROOF

Building Inspector Says Moving Picture Operator Must Have Exit.

AND OF PROPER MATERIAL

Bylaw Says House Should Have Fire Alarm Box, But Necessity Is Doubtful.

Building Inspector A. M. Piper stated this morning that the Grand Opera House would be allowed to open its gallery for moving pictures, provided a fireproof projecting box was installed before Thursday night.

Exit for Operator.

Mr. Piper said the theatre owners had been endeavoring to secure property near the house to put an extra exit in the gallery, but that they had not yet been able to secure the property. There were three exits in the gallery, and, provided a metal box was put in which an operator of a neutral is permitted to house to show pictures. In the meantime, while the house was building the special operating cabinet, a temporary arrangement would be permitted, such as was used when travelling shows used moving pictures.

Must Be Inspected.

Before this new projecting box is permitted to be used, the building inspector and the fire chief will pass upon it. One of the regulations in the city's building bylaws states that each theatre must have a fire alarm box, and the Grand Opera House does not comply with this regulation. The fire chief believes the telephone the theatre has for communication, however, and the by-law has never been enforced.

GERMANS CHECKED ON WARSAW FRONT

AMERICAN OFFICIALS SAY THEY GOT DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE FROM SUSPECTS.

San Antonio, Texas, Feb. 9.—After the private examination of Alvaro Gutierrez today, one of two men arrested by United States officers on a charge of seditious conspiracy against the United States, federal officials said they were in possession of documentary evidence which they alleged revealed further details of a plot to seize the States of Texas, Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, and the lower half of California, for the formation of an independent republic. Ultimate annexation to Mexico was contemplated, it is said. Gutierrez was held in \$5,000 bond for trial. The same bond, after preliminary hearings Saturday. Other arrests are expected.
