PARE AND HOLDEN CAUGHT. Two men arrested last night by the police under suspicion of being Pare and Holden, the escaped Napanee burglars. They answer to the descriptions of the men named, and the police authorities are confident they are the right men. The suspects are being held, awaiting the arrival of proper officers from Ontario, who have been wired for.

Toronto, June 30—The Attorney-General's department has been assured by the authorities of Campbellton, N. B., that the men arrested there last night are Pare and Holden, the escaped Napanee burglars, have all the marks of identification. Justice Mr. Greer has been instructed to proceed to Campbellton at once and bring the prisoners back if they are Pare and Holden.

OBSTRUCTIVE TACTICS.

Cause a Nasty Scene in the Italian Chamber of Deputies.

Rome, June 30—In the Chamber of Deputies to-day, the Socialists and Extreme Leftists commenced their obstructive tactics, and created an immense uproar. The President of the House, after having been the most obstructionists, and finally the Deputies left their seats, crowded on the floor, and there was such an uproar that the sitting was suspended. When it was resumed, similar tactics were used by the Extreme Leftists, who crowded the floor. The tumult was deafening, and eventually a free fight ensued and the sitting was again suspended.

TREATY SIGNED.

Confirming the Agreement Ceding Spanish Islands to Germany.

Madrid, June 30—The treaty confirming the agreement of February 12, ceding the Caroline, Pelew and Marian Islands to Germany, and the declaration granting Germany the most favored treatment from July 1, were signed to-day by Premier Silveira and the German ambassador, Count Von Radowicz.
