## MEETING OF PRESBYTERY

Reports of Work and Plans Being Made for This Season.

The Quarterly Meeting of the Presbytery of Miramichi was held on Tuesday March 14th, in St. James Hall, Newcastle, with morning, afternoon and evening sessions. There were present Rev. L. H. McLeod, Moderator, W. H. Matthews, P. W. Thompson, A. D. Archibald, H. Miller, B. C. Sallis, L. J. King, E. J. Shaw, G. A. Grant, T. Harrison, H. S. Raymond, J. C. McNeill, A. Firth, A. McRoy, Mack, H. J. P. McQuay, B. H. Penwarden, A. C. O'Brien, J. H. Anderson, ministers, and Messrs. D. Baldwin, W. J. Carruthers, P. A. Forsythe, H. F. Fairclough.

After the devotional service and adoption of the minutes the business of the Presbytery was taken up. At the request of the clerk the Presbytery adjourned to the 10th of the day and appointed P. W. Thompson to act in his stead.

Mr. Matthews submitted the report of the Synodical "Solid" School, showing encouraging features of the work and life in the congregations of the Presbytery. Mr. Archibald reported for the committee on co-operation that the Methodist and Presbyterian Congregations in New Brunswick had been visited and the matter laid before them, but that time is not yet ripe for any further definite action.

Mr. Miller brought up the matter of special offerings for the Sick Ministers Relief fund, and a more generous response in the interest of those immediately concerned. The clerk was requested to bring the matter before the congregations.

On motion of Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Anderson, Professor Charles Cunningham, Ph. D., of Bangor Theological Seminary was unanimously nominated for the Old Testament chair in Saskatoon College. Applications were made to the Home Missions Board for grants amounting to \$100 to \$150 for the following congregations: Harcourt, Bass River, New Brunswick, New Carlisle, Upper Miramichi, Douglastown and Nelson, Blackville and Millville.

Mr. McCurdy was instructed to apply to the Home Missions Board for a grant for the mission fields of Millbank and Micoon and Kouchibouguie. It is expected that George King who was a student missionary in Matapedia last summer will accept appointment as an ordained missionary to the same field after graduation in April.

Mr. McCurdy submitted the report of the Home Missions Board for the year 1921. He read Dr. Ross's full statement of his work in visiting congregations in connection with the new minimum stipend for ministers which showed faithful and effective effort and indicated that the seven congregations had come up to the new requirements and that others had made advances. A resolution was passed expressing the thanks of the Presbytery to Dr. Ross for his good service.

The congregations which attained the minimum are: New Richmond, Bathurst, Black River, Loggieville, Redford, Messingville and Red Bank. Rev. L. J. King and J. F. McCurdy made a strong request that the Presbytery should apply for a grant from the Forward Movement Extension Fund, to provide a School Home for the benefit of the boys and girls along the Gaspe coast. The Presbytery approved and agreed to make the application.

Mr. Anderson submitted the report for the past year on Sunday Schools and young people's societies. One of the encouraging features of the report was the increase in young people's organizations and also the more generous offerings made by the Sunday Schools to missions. The report which was adopted, recommended to sessions and Sunday School workers the value of boys' and girls' summer camps and the summer schools for Sunday Schools workers through the M. R. E. C. The boys' camp is to be held at Chipman, July 15 to 27, the girls camp from July 29 to Aug. 7 also at Chipman. Summer Schools for teachers will be held in this province at Sackville Aug. 4 to 11th and Woodstock Aug. 21 to 28th.

The report of the General Interests committee was given by Mr. Archibald. It was requested that the treasurers of the congregations should forward Budget money to the head office at least quarterly. Another request was to the Assembly's Committee on Literature to provide a leaflet on the use of cigarettes by boys. A resolution was passed expressing regret at the death of Dr. Kate MacMillan, Missionary.

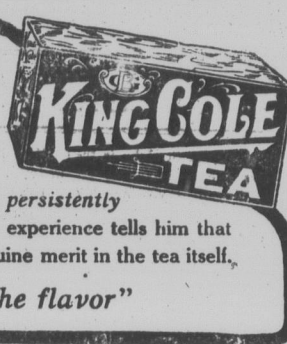

that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at the next session thereof for the passage of a Bill providing for the reorganization of the Maritime United Co-operative, Limited, (hereinafter called the company) by the separate incorporation of the several branches thereof in New Brunswick for the purpose of carrying on a general mercantile business; and that

branch shall be shareholders of the branch company incorporated in respect to such branch and not of the parent company; that the assets situate at a branch (except unpaid calls) and the liabilities incurred in connection with the business of such branch be assets and liabilities of such branch company; that the liabilities incurred at the head office of the company be divided amongst the several branches according to an apportionment made by the shareholders at the annual meeting held on the 21st day of February, 1922; that the assets of the company at or connected with the head office, after payment of all the liabilities of the company, be divided amongst the several branches under like apportionment; that shareholders not now identified with a branch shall become so identified; that an adjustment be made of accounts (including unpaid calls) between the company and the several branches; that each branch company may provide by by-law that a shareholder shall have one vote, and that the profits be distributed as a co-operative plan; that each branch company may take stock in any central company or companies which may be incorporated to buy and sell goods dealt in by the several branch companies; that the present company continue in existence for such time and with such powers as may be necessary to fully carry out the provisions of the proposed Act; that all branches shall be liable to the creditors of the company for any balance which may remain owing by reason of the default of any branch or otherwise, as on debts now owing by the company; that the company be empowered to make agreements embodying the above provisions with branches other than those to be incorporated by the proposed Act, if and when such other branches were incorporated.

## PETROGRAD LIKE A

City of the Dead

Vast Streets and Squares Covered by

Stones of Almost Untrodden

Snow.

Petrograd, March 13.—A dead city, its vast streets and squares covered by stretches of almost untrodden snow, across which a few people move like phantoms—such is the Petrograd of to-day, and many doubt if it will ever be more than it is now. There is no work and to each inhabitant there is a roomy room and a square. The city has become a vast palace of Versailles. Like Versailles, it was not grown but an artificial creation.

"Here shall be a great court," said
