MAJOR RIOTS ABROAD.
Railroad Strikers Arm Themselves with Stones.
AND OCCASION IMMENSE DAMAGE.

Several Rioting in a Seaport Town of Algeria. Over the Acquittal of a Man Who Had Shot His Wife and Her Paramour—Sardou's "Thermidor" Excites the Parisian Revolutionists, and They His the Actors and Attempt to Top France—A Wild Row Follows.

GLASGOW, Jan. 27.—A serious rioting on the part of the railroad strikers occurred yesterday. A band of masked strikers, armed with sticks and stones, attacked and severely mistreated a number of the police and an American locomotive.

IN THE "TOWN OF GRAPES"

PARIS, Jan. 27.—A despatch from Bonn, Province of Prussia, states that a serious riot has occurred there. M. Omesa, a native of Corsica and editor of an Algerian newspaper, recently shot and killed his wife and a man whom he suspected of being an adulterer.
