CHOP STUFF

A new town hall will be built at Florence.

It costs 10 cents a day to board the prisoners in the Kent county jail.

Sinclair Meteer, aged 69, of Dutton, committed suicide by cutting his throat with a razor.

Nearly 3,000 United States cars were handled by the ferries at Sarnia in one day recently.

Kent county has over one hundred garages in actual operation, not including gas filling stations.

A 3-year-old lad near Tara had both feet severed when he walked in to the path of a mower.

Dr. McWilliams, of London, has set out 40 acres of young walnut trees on his 100-acre farm near Evelyn.

Arkona voted last Monday on a by-law to expend \$15,000 for a new continuation school. The by-law carried with a majority of ten.

Two 1924 pigeons owned by R. A. Burnell of Sarnia, flew from Montreal to their loft in Sarnia on Tuesday in 10 hours and 55 minutes.

St. Thomas will have a "Tonnerville Trolley" in operation on the city street car lines during the Old Boys Reunion the first week in August.

After being in use for some fifteen years, the third and fourth readers of the public schools in the province will be changed after the coming school year. The public school speller and the public school hygiene will also become obsolete.

While working on his gasoline engine in the basement of his printing office last week, F. B. Elliott of the Alliston Herald was overcome with carbon monoxide gas and rendered unconscious. Those in the office above heard him fall and rushed to his rescue. On being removed to fresh air he shortly revived, but it was a close call.

While on his egg route one day last week, Mr. N. Leitch of Alvinston, had the misfortune to be thrown off the wagon and severely shaken up when his horse ran away near Whitton's store. However he is now able to be about again. A couple of cases of eggs and cans of cream also suffered.

Amherstburg Echo:—"The grading of eggs, which was allowed to languish for a few weeks, has again been taken up seriously by local merchants, since the visit to this district of departmental officials, who are instructing them on the regulations and serving notice that infractions of the law will be followed by prosecution and fine."

Zimmer Noah, a 22-year-old Middlesex Indian, who was serving a 20-year sentence for manslaughter and two robbery charges, in Kingston penitentiary, jumped to his death from the gallery on Monday. He dove head first onto the concrete floor below and was dead in five minutes.

Tony Charlie, Amherstburg fruitier, is displaying in his window a super-watermelon grown in Georgia on which appears the name of the grower in large letters—C. Davis, Ochlocknee, Ga., R. 1. They were evidently scratched on the fruit when small and gradually whitened and increased as the melon grew.

Motorists through Southern Ontario will be glad to learn that the new ferry dock at the foot of Ferry street, Windsor, was formally opened Monday, when the LaSalle was placed in service exclusively for the carrying of vehicles, with two boats for pedestrian traffic. The Ouellette avenue dock is being torn down and will be replaced by new buildings. A 10-minute schedule is now being maintained for foot passengers.

Announcement of the assignment of the Karn Piano Company, Limited, of Woodstock, is announced. The assignment has been made for the general benefit of the creditors, who are to hold a meeting on July 25.

A New Experiment


