The recent agricultural and industrial exhibition throughout the Province has developed some very interesting facts which should suggest important considerations to our farmers in this valley. Yarmouth, Liverpool, Truro, Antigonish, and Sidney, have all been centres for the exhibition of the various products of which each of these places is a centre.

With the exception of the fruit or exhibits fell far short of what might be expected in view of our great advantages. Thoughtful agriculturists have for some time been fully alive to the fact that they were devoting too much attention to fruit raising and too little to the production of other crops.
