THE NATIONS OF CANAAN.

In these days of Biblical Criticism, destructive and reconstructive, everything that affects the historicity of alleged facts of Scripture should be of paramount interest to the Bible student. But, as a rule, this is not the case. The historical books have been largely studied, and commentaries have been written upon them, from a purely moral and spiritual standpoint, almost ignoring history. On the other hand, the most diligent search has failed to discover corroborative evidence for antediluvian history as contained in the book of Genesis; the old connections of sacred and profane history have proved, at least in older productions, dismal failures; and the latest school of writers on the story of the Israelites, rejecting the entire book of Genesis, and doubting
