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MISSION TO AMERICAN INDIANS---VOLUNTEERS WANTED.

THE Foreign Mission Committee having resolved to send a missionary to the Cree Indians in the Hudson's Bay Territory, the Convener will be most happy to hear from parties, whose hearts the Lord may dispose to undertake this mission. The letters of Mr. Nisbet, published in the Nov. number of the Record, supply ample information on the subject, so that it is unnecessary to enlarge here at present. The missionary would require to leave in May for Red River; and after conferring with the brethren there, proceed to Fort Pitt about 800 miles distant. The committee do not favour the erection of buildings and the securing of stock, &c. at present. For the first year or so, they would expect the missionary to study the language, itinerate, explore, get acquainted with the habits of the people, and in general TO FEEL HIS WAY.
