# JOHN BRIGHT ADVOCATES AN ANGLO AMERICAN ARBITEATION TREATY.

LONDON, Aug 30.—Mr. John Bright, writing to Secretary Jones, of the London Peace Society, who is one of the deputation going to the United States to present a memorial to President Oleveland in favor of the establishment of an inter ational arbitration treaty, says: "There is talk of a permanent arbitration treaty between the United States and England. The project is a reaconable one, and discussion may lead to its adoption. If the Government of the United States were willing and were in any way United States were willing and were in any way to signify its willingness to become a party to such at reaty, there is a force of good men with us to induce our Government to consent. If this be done it will be a grand step forward in the world's march, and be followed in some not distant time by other nations willing to escape the social burden of military armaments. Two hundred members of the House of Commons sign the arbitration memorial, but far more than this number will be ready to urge the acceptance of the treaty upon our Government. If the action taken at Washington be favorable to the success of the scheme, England and the United States will still remain two nations, but I would have them always regard themselves as one people. All the houses occupied by tenants were barricaded and guarded for defence. The bouse of Mrs. Crimmons, a widow, was the first advanced upon by the bailiffs. The widow and her friends were well armed with award to the stores and boiling weten and beth were paving stones and boiling water, and both were showered upon the bailiffs with such telling effect that they were repulsed four times. The sheriff's men attempted to crowbar their way through the wills and roof, and Mrs. Crimmons through the wills and roof, and Mrs. Crimmons had the scalding water poured over their heads, face and necks. After the fourth repulse the police attempted to storm the house. They were also driven back. Finally a joint rush was made by the barliffs and police, and the house was broken into and captured. The crowd sympathized with Mrs Crimmons and did all in their power to cheer them up and to annoy and exasperate the officers.
