

Government of New Zealand may impose dumping duties on the goods specified in the notice in accordance with its anti-dumping legislation.

5. Each Government undertakes to inform the other of any changes in its anti-dumping laws and regulations and in the administration of such laws and regulations.

6. Each Government shall afford to the other, on request, the opportunity of consulting on matters relating to the administration of their respective anti-dumping systems as it might affect the interests of the other."

ARTICLE 3

Article VI of the Agreement is deleted.

ARTICLE 4

1. The Governments of New Zealand and Canada shall consult at the request of either Government on the operation of the Agreement and this Protocol or any provision thereof and on any related trade or economic matter of interest to the two Governments.

2. The two Governments shall implement procedures, including the establishment of a Joint Canada-New Zealand Consultative Committee, to achieve the purposes of this Article.

ARTICLE 5

The Governments of New Zealand and Canada, recognising the value of the preferential treatment exchanged between them, agree to consult together should either Government consider making major changes in this preferential tariff treatment.

ARTICLE 6

The provisions of this Protocol shall have effect for the Cook Islands, Niue and the Tokelau Islands on the expiration of one month from the date of notification by the Government of New Zealand to the Government of Canada that the Protocol shall be applied to these territories.

ARTICLE 7

1. This Protocol shall enter into force on a date to be agreed by exchange of letters between the parties.

2. The Agreement as amended by subsequent Exchanges of Letters and by this Protocol shall continue in force until the expiration of six months after notice has been given by either Government of its desire to terminate the Agreement.
