

PARLIAMANTARY COMMITTEES

As Canada's Parliament has been in session since the time of the late King, the House of Commons has been the main body of the Government.

Since 1918, the House has been chiefly in session:

A. Parliamentary:

- (1) Select House of Commons committee on reconstruction and re-employment.
- (2) Select House of Commons committee on social security.
- (3) Special Senate committee on post-war conditions.

B. Advisory:

- (1) Advisory committee on mobilization and rehabilitation.
- (2) Advisory committee on reconstruction.
- (3) Advisory committee on economic policy.
- (4) Advisory committee on health insurance.

In addition, the Canadian section of the Joint Canada-United States economic committee acts in an advisory capacity on several matters, including post-war planning.

The House Committee on reconstruction and re-employment committee was set up on March 2, 1945. Its duties are to study and report on the general problems of reconstruction and re-employment which may arise at the end of the war and all questions pertaining to them. It also studies conditions of the previous session of the Commons.

The House Committee on social security was set up on March 2, 1945. Its duties are to study and report on the general problems of social security in Canada. It has five sub-committees: (1) Social Security Administration, (2) Social Security Legislation, (3) Social Security Finance, (4) Social Security Administration of Other Countries, and (5) Social Security Administration of Canada. The committee has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public. It has also held public hearings on the health insurance bill and the social security bill.
