By Mr. Foster:—Order of the House for a copy of all letters, telegrams or other documents, received by the Minister of Labour, or the Minister of Immigration and Colonization, in connection with the request of the Canadian International Paper Company for the admission of one or more lumber scalers from the United States into the Province of New Brunswick.

Mr. Speakman, seconded by Mr. Lucas, moved,—That, in the opinion of this House, consideration should be given to the setting up of a system of intermediate credits for agriculture.

And a Debate arising thereon;

Mr. Irvine, seconded by Mr. Spencer, moved in amendment thereto:

That the motion be amended by adding the following words:

“And that this motion be referred to the Banking and Commerce Committee for consideration thereon and report to the House.”

After Debate thereon, the question being put on the amendment; it was agreed to.

And the question being put on the main motion as amended; it was agreed to.

Miss Macphail, seconded by Mr. Evans, moved,—That, in the opinion of this House, for every one hundred dollars spent for war one dollar should be spent to promote peace by setting up a Chair of International Relationships and by instituting International Scholarships in each Canadian University.

And a Debate arising thereon, and continuing;
