By Mr. Lennard:—1. How many Reserve Force Officers in the Eastern Command received pay and allowances in excess of \$800.00 during the calendar year 1951?

2. What are their names and what were the amounts each received?

By Mr. Lennard:—1. How many Reserve Force Officers in the Western Command received pay and allowances in excess of \$800.00 during the calendar year 1951?

2. What are their names and what were the amounts each received?

By Mr. Lennard:—1. How many Reserve Force Officers in the Central Command received pay and allowances in excess of \$800.00 during the calendar year 1951?

2. What are their names and what were the amounts each received?

By Mr. Lennard:—1. How many Reserve Force Officers in the Prairie Command received pay and allowances in excess of \$800.00 during the calendar year 1951?

2. What are their names and what were the amounts each received?

By Mr. Knowles:—1. During each fiscal year, commencing with the year ending March 31, 1945, how much advertising by dollars, has been placed by each department of the Federal Government, or by any branch or division or agency operating under any department, through Cockfield, Brown and Company Limited?

2. Who is the Ottawa representative of this firm?

3. On what basis is such advertising placed through this firm?

4. Through what other firms has advertising been placed during each of the fiscal years set out in question (1), and what is the total amount placed through each such other firm?

By Mr. Wright:—1. Does the Dominion Government hold the mineral and oil rights on the land included in the Dominion Experimental Farms at Indian Head and Swift Current?

2. Have these mineral and oil rights been disposed of within the last five years?

3. If so, to whom and on what conditions?

By Mr. Dube:—1. How many temporary track men are employed by the Canadian National Railway, at the present time, in extra track gangs working on each of the Western, Central and Atlantic regions?

2. What wages are paid to these men in each of the above regions?

3. Does the Canadian National Railway collect any amount for board from these men? If so, how much in each of these regions?

By Mr. Thatcher:—1. How many housing units are under construction at Moose Jaw for married personnel, at the new Royal Canadian Air Force air station?

2. Will this be the total number constructed, or are additional units planned?
