The Honourable Senator Tanner, from the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills, to whom was referred the Bill (K), intituled: "An Act to incorporate The Board of American Missions of The United Lutheran Church in America (Canada)," reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the Senate with several amendments, which he was ready to submit whenever the Senate would be pleased to receive the same.

The said amendments were then read by the Clerk, as follows:—

1. Page 1, line 15. For clause 1 of the Bill substitute the following:—

"1. The Members of the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of The Board of American Missions of The United Lutheran Church in America, namely: Henry Jacob Pflum, Jr., of Buffalo in the state of New York, clergyman; Addison Horner Durboraw, of Narbeth in the state of Pennsylvania, executive officer; Hamilton Torrey Walker, of Philadelphia in the state of Pennsylvania, treasurer; Emil William Weber, of Pottsville in the state of Pennsylvania, clergyman; Chester Stewart Simonton, of Harrisburg in the state of Pennsylvania, clergyman; John Edward Harms, of Hagerstown in the state of Maryland, clergyman; William Eck, of Albany in the state of New York, undertaker; John Jacob Scherer, Jr., of Richmond in the state of Virginia, clergyman; Franklin Clark Fry, of Akron in the state of Ohio, clergyman; all of the said states being in the United States of America; and John Schmeider, of Kitchener in the province of Ontario, Canada, clergyman, and such persons as may hereafter be appointed directors of the Corporation, are hereby incorporated under the name of 'The Canada Board of American Missions of The United Lutheran Church in America,' in this Act called 'the Corporation'."

2. Page 2, line 1. For clause 2 of the Bill substitute the following:—

"The objects of the Corporation shall be:—

- (a) To promote, maintain, superintend and carry on, in any and all parts of Canada, in accordance with the doctrinal laws, constitution, acts and rulings of The United Lutheran Church in America, any or all of the work of Home Missions and Church Extension of that church;
- (b) To organize, maintain and carry on, in any and all parts of Canada, charities and missions and to erect, maintain and conduct therein churches, schools, colleges, orphanages and hospitals;
- (c) To advance in other lawful ways education, religion, charity and benevolence;
- (d) To organize and carry on, in any and all parts of Canada, in furtherance of the lawful objects of the Corporation, and not otherwise, the businesses of printing and publishing."

3. Page 2, line 19. For "said" substitute "such".
