INDIAN ACT—REQUESTS THAT SECTIONS BE PUT IN FORCE

Question No. 117-Mr. Howard:

- 1. Have any provinces requested that section 95(2) of the Indian Act be declared to be in force? If so, which provinces, upon what dates and what action resulted therefrom?
- 2. Have any provinces requested that section 95(3) of the Indian Act be declared to be in force? If so, which provinces, upon what dates and what action resulted therefrom?
- 3. Have any councils of Indian bands requested that section 96A(2) of the Indian Act be declared to be in force? If so, which bands, upon what dates and what action resulted therefrom?

Answer by: Hon. Ellen L. Fairclough (Minister of Citizenship and Immigration):

1. Four provinces, the Yukon and the Northwest Territories have requested and obtained an application of the provisions of section 95(2) of the Indian Act:

In 1951, the lieutenant-governor in council of the province of Prince Edward Island formally requested to have section 95 of the Act brought into force in that province. However, no action was taken on this request as it would have had no meaning, as the liquor laws of the province of Prince Edward Island at that time made no provision for the consumption of intoxicants in a public place.

2. On March 25, 1957, the lieutenantgovernor in council of Ontario petitioned the governor in council to proclaim subsection 3 of section 95 of the Indian Act as being in force in that province. On November 6, 1958, the governor in council issued a proclamation declaring section 95(3) of the Indian Act to be in force in Ontario.

3. The councils of the following Indian bands have requested that section 96A(2) of the Indian Act be declared in force in their reserves:
