2. That all candidates who successfully pass the written papers be subjected to a thorough oral examination by an examination board appointed by the Faculty.

In conclusion your committee wishes to point out that in submitting a draft curriculum it fully realizes that the draft is tentative and will have to be modified from time to time in the light of experience.

Much remains to be done in working out the details of the suggested readings in the various courses and in other matters, and it would in consequence be impracticable, even if desirable, to bring the changes recommended into effect with the class entering the Faculty next autumn (1925). There appears, however, to be no reason why the necessary work cannot be done in the course of next winter, and it is therefore recommended that the changes be put into effect with the class entering the University in the autumn of 1926.
