Note.-Among other tangible aspects of the Province are : (1) the valuable public buildings erected and owned by the Province ; (2) the site of the old Parliament build ings, valued at \$500,000, and the parcel of 21 acres, part of the Queen street asy'um farm, valued at 150,000; (3) unpaid purchase moneys on sales of Crown lands to the amount of 8800,000; (4) the standing timber on a vast extent of territory; (5) unsole Crown lands, including our mineral lands; (6) a yearly subsidy of \$1,196,000, guaranteed to us in perpetuity under the B. N. A. Act, and a further amount of \$142,000 a year, guaranteed to us for all time, under the Dominion Act of 1884.
