The New Brunswick University is an institution which has wielded for the greater part of a century a potent influence upon the educational interests of the province. The original charter of the College of New Brunswick was issued in the year 1800. In 1825 this charter was surrendered to the Crown and another granted to a body corporate, under the name of King's College. In 1859 an act was passed by the Provincial Assembly establishing the University of New Brunswick and abolishing the theological department. The college, in one form or another, has always enjoyed a provincial endowment, and since 1871 has formed the apex of that legislative creation which is at once the special pride and highest honor of New Brunswick, — its free-school system of education.
