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NEWS ADVERSE TO UPTURN IN WHEAT

Beautiful Snow in Winter Grain Belt Gladdens Hearts of Bears.

CHICAGO, Dec. 23.—Widening of the snow area in the winter crop belt proved to be more of a handicap today than the wheat bulls could overcome.

Besides the bearish influence of a larger production to fall soon wheat cables were against traders who were on the outlook for signs of an upturn.

Prospect of winter marketing and of increased feeding as a result of stormy weather lifted the price of corn.

Wheat futures closed at Liverpool lower unchanged; corn, unchanged to lower.

HOGS UP TO \$9.10 AT UNION YARDS

Small Receipts Now That Xmas Demands Have Been Supplied.

A natural falling off in receipts was in evidence at the Union Stock Yards yesterday. There were only 22 cars with 218 cattle, 28 calves, 377 hogs and 180 sheep.

Hogs were in good demand and were quoted as high as \$9.10 per cwt. red and watered, an advance of 25 cents over Monday.

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TEN CARS ROLLED OVER EMBANKMENT

Derailment on C. P. Toronto-Sudbury Line at Bolton Tied Up Traffic.

BOLTON, Dec. 23.—The derailment of ten cars of freight on a C. P. R. train at Cedar Mills, Ont., seven miles north of Bolton, on the Toronto-Muskoka line, was the cause of tying up this division and paralyzing passenger traffic for the day.

Two hundred feet of roadbed was torn up. The Winnipeg train, due here at 9 this morning, which was running in two sections, due to heavy travel, in the city at 2 o'clock.

The auxiliaries from West Toronto and Muskoka went to the scene of the derailment, but experienced considerable difficulty as the cars rolled down a 50-foot embankment.

CLIMBS JUDGE'S KNEE TO GAIN HIS FAVOR Little Girl of Seven Doesn't Want to Leave "Auntie" for Her Mother.

MONTREAL, Dec. 23.—(Can. Press.)—Climbing upon Mr. Justice Charbonneau's knee and telling him that she did not want to go and live with her mother because she was better treated at the house of her "auntie," a pretty little girl of seven years of age, here today.

The little girl showed Mr. Justice Charbonneau her dolls and other playthings, as if realizing that decision adverse to her wishes would necessarily entail a separation from these childish delights.

The case was that of Dame Jennie Johnson, mother of the child, v. Irma Elsie, "auntie," a boarding house keeper of Mansfield street, her mother sought by way of habeas corpus to get possession of the youngster.

Evidence was submitted to show the mother had been an inmate of the jail on account of her intemperate habits.
